

Walking as Christ Walked

1 John 2:1-11

In 1 John 2:6 we learn of an obligation enjoined upon every child of God: "He that saith he abideth in Him ought himself also so to walk, even as He walked." If we ought to walk as Jesus Christ walked, then the obvious question is this: How did our Lord Jesus walk?

Consider the following:

- 1) Jesus walked in complete dependence upon His Heavenly Father. "Verily, Verily, I say unto you, The Son can do nothing of Himself, but what He seeth the Father do: for what things soever He doeth, these also doeth the Son likewise" (*John 5:19*).
- **2)** Jesus' priority was His Father's business: "Did you not know that I must be about My Father's business?" (*Luke 2:49*).
- 3) The constant ambition of Jesus was to please His Father. "He that sent Me is with Me: the Father hath not left Me alone; for I do always those things that please Him" (*John 8:29*).
- **4)** Doing the Father's will was His constant duty and delight: "My meat [food] is to do the will of Him that sent Me, and to finish His work" (*John 4:34*).
- 5) Jesus was determined to do the work that His Heavenly Father had given Him to do: "I must work the works of Him that sent Me, while it is day: the night cometh, when no man can work" (*John 9:4*).
- **6)** Jesus' mission was to communicate the truth and the teachings of God. "For I have not spoken of Myself; but the Father which sent Me, He gave Me a commandment, what I should say, and what I should speak" (*John 12:49*).
- 7) Jesus' only aim was to glorify God. "Glorify Thy Son, that Thy Son also may glorify Thee" (*John 17:1*).

May we walk as He walked!
