
Don't Forget Adam's Third Son!

Genesis 4:24-5:8

When most people think of Adam's sons, they immediately think of Cain and Abel and the account of the first murder



in human history (*Genesis 4*). Yet Adam had three sons, the third being Seth (*Gen. 4:25*). Let's not forget about Seth! Adam actually had numerous sons (*Gen. 5:4*), but only three are named. One was a **murderer**, one a **martyr** and the third a **multiplier**.

Everyone one on the face of the earth today has descended from Seth, including Christ the Messiah (*Luke 3:38*). No one descended from Abel because he was murdered. Cain's ungodly line perished with the destruction of the Flood. Seth's line included Noah. Everyone in the post-flood world has Seth and Noah as ancestors.

Eve named her son Seth as one appointed to be Abel's substitute, to carry on in the place of her martyred son (*Gen. 4:25*).

Bible students often speak of "the godly line of Seth." It cannot be proved that every person in the line of Seth mentioned in Genesis chapter 5 was a believer, but Enos, Enoch and Noah certainly were, and probably also Lamech, who mentioned the LORD in his prophecy (*Gen. 5:29*).


An interesting statement is made in Genesis 4:26, "And to Seth, to him also there was born a son, and he called his name Enos: then began men to call upon the name of the LORD."
